Course Description

CHC33015 Certificate III in Individual Support are currently offered online study. These nationally recognised qualifications provide learners with the skills necessary to work in a range of contexts in an individual support setting.

This qualification reflects the role of care workers in the age care, disability and community setting who follow an individualised plan to provide person-centred support to people who may require support due to ageing, disability, or some other reason.

Total full time course duration up to 29 weeks.

 - CHCDIV001 - Work with diverse people
 - CHCLEG001 - Work legally and ethically
 - HLTAAP001 - Recognise healthy body systems
 - HLTWHS002 - Follow safe work practices for direct client care

 - 6 elective units
 - CHCAGE001 – Facilitate the empowerment of older people
 - CHCAGE005 – Provide support to people living with dementia
 - CHCCCS011 – Meet personal support needs
 - CHCDISS002 – Follow established person-centred behaviour supports
 - CHCHCS001 – Provide home and community support services
 - HLTINF001 – Comply with infection prevention and control policies and procedures
- Students can commence Work Placement once they are eligible for having been assessed as Satisfactory (S) in all the Assessment/s.

Work Placement

A mandatory work placement is a requirement of this course, regardless of whether the individual is already working within the industry, the purpose of which is to facilitate and ensure workplace-based assessment. All learners undertaking this qualification will be provided with a structured learning plan that articulates the purpose of the placement, the requirements of the workplace training and assessment as they align to specific units of competency within the qualification.

Learners undertaking this qualification will be required to complete and evidence of a minimum of 120 hours of work placement, the evidence of this will be captured in a Work Placement Logbook. The Logbook will be signed off by the learner, their workplace supervisor/mentor, and their Trainer and Assessor in Rise Education and Training . The Logbook is designed to capture:

Shift/s undertaken as part of 120 hours mandatory work placement

Duties and task undertaken on each shift and what unit of competency they apply to

The Logbook entries must be completed each day that a shift is attended, and all details must be completed. Rise Education and Training Administration maintains a list of suitable placement venues to support student to secure a vocational placement. Rise Education and Training will support and make all attempts to secure a place for the student.

Required Work Placement hours:

Students are required to attend at least 7.5 hours per/day shift work placement during a workplace session. Students will be advised in writing or electronically and provided a work placement logbook to record their work placement hours or work experience. Trainer/Assessor will schedule regular workplace visits, to observe and assess on the job skills and performance.
